

anticipation, as the church awaits Christ's birth. It also symbolises the present situation of the church in these "last days" as God's people wait for the return of Christ in glory. The church is in a similar situation to Israel in exile at the end of the Old Testament, waiting and hoping for the Messiah whilst looking back to God's past actions on their behalf. In the same way the church today looks back during the Advent of Christ's coming in celebration whilst looking forward in anticipation to the coming of Christ in glory, when He will return for His people.

This is the season of faith and hope. Faith is more clearly expressed in the way people live than in what they claim to believe: Abraham was one of the first patriarchs to step out in faith and his seed continues to this day; the Prophets were the whistle-blowers of their time, speaking God's word authoritatively into the situations of their day; John the Baptist displayed faith as he heralded the arrival of the Messiah, preparing the way for His ministry; and in faith Mary carried the Hope of the World with humility.

Our journey in faith through this advent season will culminate in the released promise—the Messiah—at Christmas. The faith God calls us to live by is not merely an intellectual ascent to a set of beliefs, but something which is active and affects our lifestyles in a real, tangible way. That is why Christians are to be "Carriers of Faith".
