JOINT PARISHES MEETING

E HAD A GOOD MEETING ON Saturday 28th January with representation from both Parishes together at RPC, exploring the question of remaining as two Parishes or merging as one. We had 17 members from Wennington and 32 from Rainham attend, which was a little disappointing but knowing there were a variety of reasons for absences.

Henry gave an introductory overview of the bigger picture with PIMMs and the Beam Park development that is coming, leading to growing collaboration across the parishes becoming more the norm in the future. He went on to explain what possible merging was, and what it was not—It would mean one administration and financial structure with a single joint PCC. But it would also retain our current separate identities as worshipping centres and focal points of mission in our respective communities. Any merger into one parish would retain unity in diversity and the sense of being one church with a shared ownership that respects each other's ministry and missional calling.

The meeting was then opened up to questions and we had Nathan Whitehead from the Diocese with us who is the advisor on these matters to help with some of the information and clarification on the points raised. Concerns were raised about our two grade listed buildings and whether this was manageable by one body to maintain. Also whether one PCC could work through joint agendas with issues needing to be addressed from both communities. There was a recognition that our worshipping communities at Rainham and Wennington were in a healthier relationship with one another and this was something we wanted to continue encouraging and building on.

It was also expressed that this was an opportunity for stepping into the unknown and exploring the possibilities as we would be in control of the whole process and able to pull out at any stage if it was felt not to be right. We concluded by taking a straw poll through a show of hands from both parishes to indicate whether we wanted to explore further to the next stage or remain as we are as two parishes. It was explained that to proceed we would need a majority from both parishes. The figures expressed at the meeting were as follows: RPC voted 10 for and 16 against; WPC voted 2 for and 14 against. Additional figures from those who did not attend were RPC, 2 for merging and from WPC, 2 for, 2 against and 3 abstentions. As we do not have a majority for merging, we will remain as two Parishes.





Bishop Stephen's Visit to RPC

HIS WAS A wonderful occasion as our two parishes came together to celebrate Communion with Bishop Stephen, the Bishop of Chelmsford. This was the first time in anyone's memory that we have had a visit from a Bishop of Chelmsford. It was a privilege to have him, and a joyous time. He gave us an inspirational talk and was extremely complimentary about the ministry and mission at Rainham and Wennington, with, as he put it, "strong leadership" steering its course. He was very impressed with our

thematic teaching programme and the challenge of taking the Christmas narratives beyond the festive season, moving from the "Disney Christmas" encounter, as he put it, to the harsh realities of what this is actually about. The Bishop stayed for refreshments after the service and engaged with many people before having to move on to his next engagement. The Lord's Favour

N JANUARY, WE considered the possibility that "This is the Year of the Lord's Favour", but what does "The Lord's Favour" look like and who is it for? Isaiah gives a glimpse of it in Isaiah 61 and Jesus mentions it at the start of His ministry in Luke 4:18.

Favour is looking kindly upon someone or treating someone with special regard. The Bible stresses the kindnesses and graciousness of God and Jesus Christ which are not the result of human merit or achievement: "Finding Favour" means gaining approval, acceptance, special benefits or blessings and, spiritually, there is a close association between favour, grace and mercy.

Favour that human beings receive from God depends on His good pleasure and is often extended freely in response to prayer and righteous living. Indeed, in its primary meaning, "grace" is undeserved favour, and the New Testament word translated "grace" literally means "gift". Human approval can also be gained through faithful and effective service (Genesis 39:9) and sometimes God's favour can prepare the way in difficult circumstances (Exodus 3:21). This month, we will use four characters from the Old Testament to explore the concept of favour. As we do, we will see that a personal knowledge of God together with a quiet wisdom and dedication to service not only bring personal favour from God and humankind but can also be a channel of blessing, not simply for individuals but also for the churches and communities we are called to serve.



From Bishop Peter

OU WILL RECALL Bishop Peter's very powerful prayer requests last year. In his recent letter to the clergy and lay readers, Bishop Peter asks how we view and receive the Christmas story, "...against a background of critical national and international uncertainty after the surprising political events in recent months both here and in the USA, and refugee crisis and the continuing horrendous conflicts in Syria, the Middle East and North Africa, as well as other more hidden corners of God's world. Daily our world seems to be becoming a much more insecure and dangerous place...

All this brings particular social and political consequences in the glorious diversity of East London and south west Essex in terms of anxious futures and demand for accommodation. But at Christmas we celebrate the fact that our God has entered into His diverse and dangerous world and so must we in mission and social action. Pray with me as we journey together into a new year that we may lead, act and pastor effectively in the midst of where God has placed us for the extension of His Kingdom.

Nobody on earth is better placed to bring Christ in and respond to current uncertainties than those of us called into His church. As Teresa of Avila prayed, "Christ has no body but ours, no hands, no feet on earth but ours. Ours are the eyes with which He looks with compassion on this world. Ours are the feet with which He walks to do good. Ours are the hands, with which He blesses all the world". Let us enter in, to fulfill her prayer and ours".

I believe that is a call to His whole church as we bring His liht and His love into the darkness of our broken world in the communities we serve.
