

ONE PARISH OR TWO?

A Joint Parishes Meeting Saturday 28th January 2017

ollowing MY PASTORAL letter in the September issue of the Newsletter, we are now in a position to explore this question further. As promised, I invite both Parishes at Rainham and Wennington to a joint meeting on Saturday 28th January at 10:30am in RPC, where together we can discuss any issues, questions, concerns and aspirations concerning a possible merger of the two Parishes.

At the meeting, I will introduce everyone to the concept of two Parishes becoming one as a possibility we will be exploring together, and highlight the pros and cons of such a possible merger. The main issues will revolve around administration, the make-up of one PCC, the financial structure, and our identity as worshipping communities. But we will not gloss over any concerns or questions. Some questions we will be able to answer, others will be part of the process of our decision making. Advantages we may want to consider include:

- The Missional benefit.
- Cuts down on Administration.
- Reduces the number of meetings.
- Can reduce the number of officers (e.g. Wardens).
- May be less work for the Incumbent.
- One body in one place more efficient than 2 bodies in 2 places (PCC).



And disadvantages we may want to consider such as:

- Possible feeling of loss of identity.
- Fears of being swallowed up.
- Loss of control.

These are important issues and I therefore encourage all of you to put this date in your diary and come and participate in this decision making process. We are all part of the body of Christ here and it is as one body that we want to engage in whatever future God is leading us in.

I wrote previously explaining that the scheme needs unanimous backing from both churches, but if necessary a majority of both PCCs and congregations (independently) would suffice. I also explained that if there is then a desire from both parishes to pursue this further, we will hold another joint PCC meeting to take the matter into the formal route with the Diocese. Nothing will be rushed and everyone will be part of the consultation and decision making process, whichever way we decide this should go.

There will be two outcomes from this informal meeting:

- 1. We decide collectively not to pursue this any further and remain as we are.
- 2. We decide collectively to take this to the next stage and formally apply to merge as one Parish.

If we decide on 2. the next stages are as follows:

Stage 1: After the informal consultation, a joint PCC meeting would formally decide on behalf of the church to make application to the Diocese for the process to begin.

Stage 2: The Deanery Mission and Pastoral Committees are informed for its consideration.

Stage 3: Area and Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Committees would consider the proposals.

Stage 4: If needed, the Pastoral Secretary would meet clergy and wardens to discuss the proposals before the Measure was issued.

Stage 5: Proposals go to all interested parties and 2 months allowed for response. Objections would be raised at the next APCM meeting.

Stage 6: Formal proposals signed by the Bishop and sent to the Church Commissioners who would be asked to publish a Draft Pastoral Scheme.

Stage 7: Scheme returned via Pastoral Secretary to all interested parties. It would be displayed at all places of worship for a specified period. During this period (normally about 2 months), anyone in the Parish could lodge an objection.

Stage 8: If there are no objections, the scheme would take effect.

Stage 9: If there are objections, the Bishop (or Archdeacon) would respond to them. If objections are sustained, the Church Commissioners would consider the case and decide after hearing both sides.

The whole thing usually takes about 9–12 months, but could be longer. Consultation with both Parishes continues throughout this process.

Please continue to pray for wisdom for our two parishes as we seek to discern the way forward under the Holy Spirit's guidance, remembering that we are His church.

As Teresa of Avila prayed, "Christ has no body but ours, no hands, no feet on earth but ours. Ours are the eyes with which He looks with compassion on this world. Ours are the feet with which He walks to do good. Ours are the hands, with which He blesses all the world". Let us enter in, to fulfill her prayer and ours".

I believe that is a call to His whole church as we bring His liht and His love into the darkness of our broken world in the communities we serve.
