

Who is St Paul?

St Paul is one of the great figures of the New Testament. He is second only to Jesus in his contribution to the teachings of the early church and was a dynamic and extraordinary figure in the first century of the Christian era.

The question remains who St Paul was and what is his message for today's Church. A figure to be admired and emulated but not without controversy and challenge.

This series of talks and discussions will look at five aspects of his life.

Bishop Peter Hill will lead us on Paul's mission work from the perspective of the Church at Philippi, September 19, 26, October 3.

Revd Dr John Brown will look at Paul the man and his world, October 10.


Canon Ann Easter will look at Paul and his attitude to women, October 17

Only by Grace

e are familiar with the acronym

G.R.A.C.E. relating to "God's Riches At Christ's Expense"; the idea of God giving us what we don't deserve and withholding what we do deserve (mercy). But His grace is more than just a gift. It is what defines us. We live in relationship to God only through His grace and by no other way, because He has paid heavily for our redemption. As such it is important that, as Christians, we do not trivialise or undermine the significance of grace upon our lives. If we can enter only by grace into His presence, then we need to be aware of our response to what He offers us in Jesus. This month we will explore some characteristics of His grace and our part in this relationship with God that not only calls for, but even demands, our surrender and allegiance to Him in all He has bestowed upon us.
