# May Fayre at Rainham

A wonderful time was had by all at this year's May Fayre.



E SEE CHURCH at its best when we see the kind of witness that took place in our community

on Fayre day. It is estimated that between 3000 and 4000 people came and engaged on a day where the sun shone, it was hot and the atmosphere wonderful. There were stalls, activities, live music, things to see and do, not to mention the variety of food available, and a great deal of community interaction. So what about our church's part?

Our interaction came in four main areas: the **Ship Centre**, **two Stalls**, the **Refreshment Tent** in the church yard and the **/o1**.

Flower Festival in church. I want to begin by thanking everyone who came and took part, helping in various areas from putting up the marquee, helping on stalls and in church, creating wonderful floral displays, ministering in prayer, or serving in the Ship. There was a real sense of fellowship and joyous participation had by all.

The Ship Centre was full the whole day, as you would expect, serving in their usual loving way, creating an atmosphere of welcome and good food. There was a bustle of people coming and going and conversations on all kinds of levels. The stalls had the usual variety of Fair Trade goods, and a mixture

of items for sale ranging from tea services, hand knitted dolls and figures, royal memorabilia, CDs and DVDs, wrapping paper, albums, Bibles...the list goes on. The Refreshment Tent was serving cakes, teas and coffees throughout, with a sitting area that was constantly used by those passing through and wanting a break amid their meandering through the stalls and events taking place around them.

And then there was the Flower Festival in church. We had a thematic approach to the displays this year based on Scripture readings that took people on a journey. Each focal point of floral display centred on a reading and thought for people to engage with. At the same time, we had people asking for prayer throughout the day and we were able to bless them in this way. There were many, many comments about how beautiful the church was and how meaningful and thought provoking the displays were. Perhaps this was reflective of the whole fayre... both beautiful and meaningful.

























N THE OCTOBER 2017 newsletter an article was written regarding the proposal to allow baptised individuals, particularly children, to taken part in receiving Holy Communion. I would like to provide you with an update on where we are at with this process. Following my October 2017 article and notices in church, the proposal went ahead. In order to allow our baptised children to take part in receiving Holy Communion, we must adhere to a 4 step criteria:

- 1. The child must be baptised.
- 2. The child must want to receive Holy Communion.
- The parent/guardian of the child must consent to their child taking Holy Communion.
- 4. The child must undergo a preparation course to ensure they have a full understanding of baptism and Holy Communion.

With this criteria in mind, we wrote to parents/ guardians at the beginning of the year and we had 13 children sign up to the preparation course. Our Youth and Children Ministry (YCM) leaders attended a training afternoon to equip /03.

and empower them to lead this course. Parents/guardians were also invited to this training.

The preparation course started at the beginning of April 2018. It is a two-month course which is being held during our GIG and Ignite groups at RPCs 10:30am service. Our last session is on 20th May 2018. I feel this course has really been a blessing to our children where we have seen growth in their understanding, faith and maturity.

We offered all our children the opportunity to attend the course, where they were baptised or not, as well as encouraging visitors to attend odd sessions as well. Although these children will not be able to participate in receiving Holy Communion at this time, we wanted to ensure all children were included as they can all benefit from the teaching in the preparation course, helping each in their own faith and understanding. We have seen in some of these children, an interest grow in them wanting to be baptised which is amazing.

We will be using the Holy Communion service at RPC on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2018 as a celebration of our baptised children completing the course and the receiving of their first Holy Communion.

In order to ensure we continue to meet the above 4 step criteria during Holy Communion:

- All children must attend Holy Communion with a parents/ guardian or YCM leader.
- The children who can receive Holy Communion will be encouraged to put their hands out, where those children not will be encourage to put their arms by their side. This will help the lay people identify who can take Holy Communion.
- The lay person will confirm with the appropriate parent/guardian or YCM leader if their child can receive Holy Communion.

- The lay person will confirm with the child if they want to receive Holy Communion.
- The parent/guardians or YCM leader will only confirm that their child can take Holy Communion on the knowledge they are baptised and have completed the preparation course.

We will be providing further guidance to the Holy Communion team, YCM leaders and parents/ guardians on this to ensure we are meeting the necessary requirements. We will also aim to continue this course as and when required.
