

N THE CHRISTIAN CALENDAR, Harvest time is a time for giving thanks to the Lord for all that He has provided us with, and to remember that all good gifts come from God. It is also another great opportunity to remember and give to those who are in need. At Rainham, we will be having our Harvest Service on Sunday 2nd October, and at Wennington on Sunday 9th October. At both services we will be taking up our Harvest Offering, and this year all gifts (both financial, and non-perishable foods) will be going towards the work of the Rainham FoodBank, which does amazing work in feeding the hungry and those in need in our community. If people are offering perishable goods such and fruit and vegetables, they will be going to The Ship, which partners with the Rainham FoodBank in its vision to feed the hungry.

The Rainham FoodBank is always accepting donations of non-perishable goods, so please do remember to buy an extra non-perishable item and make use of the box at the back of church, or even the container in Tesco.

We have a number of events happening in Rainham and Wennington for the Harvest time, and ways to focus your giving this season.





Harvest Lunch in aid of C.H.I

Trish Nelson will be hosting a harvest lunch on Saturday 15th October at her house from 12pm–2pm. N SUNDAY 13TH NOVEMBER, WPC will be commemorating Remembrance Day on Wennington Green and in St Mary & St Peter's Church. The morning service will start at 10am and finish at 10:40am. Those who are able, will then walk to Wennington Green for the Remembrance Service; commemorating the Wennington residents who gave their lives in serving their country.

For those unable to walk to, and stand, for the service, a radio commentary of the service at the Cenotaph will be relayed in the church. After the commemoration, there will be an opportunity for fellowship with refreshments and the recounting of memories in the church.

The service at RPC will begin as usual at the War Memorial (Clocktower) in Rainham

Village at 10:30am, and will continue in St Helen & St Giles Church after the commemoration. As usual, the invitation to join us for all or part of the event is extended to all those in the Rainham and Wennington communities.



Re-Envisioning Ministry

Revd Henry Pradella invites us to prayerfully review our areas of ministry.

S THE BODY of Christ here at Rainham and Wennington, we will be exploring this month our areas of ministry. In both our teaching and our practical response, I am asking each of you to review and discern prayerfully what you are called to participate in as your ministry for the coming year. This is something

we have not done for a while and is overdue. We will all be starting with a blank ministries list and everyone has the equal opportunity of laying down, continuing or starting new ways of serving this church and this community.

How will this be done?

- There will be a number of lists on the notice boards in both churches, with various areas of ministry.
- We will shortly be sending out descriptions of what each area of ministry involves and there will be a hard copy of these pinned to the notice boards.
- After prayerful consideration, please add your name to whichever area(s) you want to serve in.
- There will be space to add other ministries/initiatives not mentioned that you may want to consider offering.
- This list will be up for the next two months (September & October) giving you plenty of time to explore and evaluate your input.
- Once the lists are completed we will then use these as the basis of our rotas and areas of serving.
- Training will be provided where necessary.

Three further things you need to be aware of:

- Until these new lists are compiled and activated (date TBC but hopefully November), we will remain with our current lists and rotas.
- If your name is not added to the new lists, we will assume you wish to step down from the area you are currently serving in.
- Key areas of ministry and leadership roles require you to be part of a Small Group. There are existing groups you can join, but we will also be launching three new ones this year.

If you have any questions concerning your ministry and want to speak to someone about it, please contact Henry.
