# Parables of Jesus

that each teach a moral or spiritual lesson by analogy or similarity. They comprise an important part of Jesus' teaching being regarded by scholars as definitely ascribed to the historical Jesus and thereby His authentic words. The stories are taken from the familiar life of the time of Jesus and all of the great themes of Jesus' preaching can be found in one or more of the parables.

The Kingdom of God is central to much of Jesus' teachings and many of His parables are concerned with this; other parables have an unexpected twist or surprise ending to catch the reader's attention. In explaining to the disciples why He spoke in parables, Jesus quoted from Isaiah 9:9–10. Isaiah had found that people were lost in sin and resented hearing God's word—Jesus also experienced the same disappointment.

It is the lesson to be learned from each parable that is important more than the story itself and in the coming few weeks we will be looking at some of the parables of Jesus trying to discover the key lessons which we can learn from His teaching.
