

Gift Days in September & October


Details of some Gift Days that we will be holiding over the next two months to help with the restoration works for our church buildings.

Le have two important developments at RPC and WPC that we want to move forward. At Rainham, one development is the purchase of soft pew seating (see sample in church) and the other is the repair work on the church tower. The pew seats will cost us £6000 and the church tower £63000 (of which we have raised around £5000 so far and hope to get some external funding to help). At Wennington, we also want to purchase soft pew seating, which will cost £3000 and in addition we have an urgent priority to demolish the existing hall, which will cost £11000.

We are going to have a "Gift Day" in September for the pew seats both at Rainham and Wennington and another in October for the church tower at Rainham and the hall demolition at Wennington. The idea of a gift day is that you prayerfully consider making a "substantial" monetary gift to the church towards the chosen projects and bring it on any of the Sundays that month as your offering/contribution. If possible we would like you to use the gift aid envelopes in church for this purpose. You may wish to just contribute towards one of the two projects, or both... however you feel led.

Remember, September is for pew seats, October is for RPC church tower/WPC hall.May the Lord bless you as you seek His will in this matter.

Services and Themes for September

A Statement of Faith

OVING ON FROM last month, it is from a secure sense of belonging that we grow into believing. But what is it that we as Christians actually believe? A "Statement of Faith" is a summary of the key beliefs to which a group or organisation adheres. For Christians, our key statements of faith are the Creeds—the Apostles Creed and the Nicene Creed. Developed a great ecumenical councils and intended as statements of beliefs by which every Christian should be bound, thye are still used in our church services today. Differences in their interpretation have led to there being many Christian denonminations today, but there are nonetheless some key things which are fundamental to our Christian belief:

- We believe in a God Who is creator and redeemer of the world; totally reliable and trustworthy; the Father of Jesus and of all believers. We believe that God is alive and active in the world and that the deepest possible expression of His character is love: He is a relational God, at all times wanting to be involved with us, His people.
- We believe in the universality of sin which broke our relationship with Father God.
 We believe in God the Son who became incarnate in the person of Jesus Christ for the redemption of the world. Jesus is both

fully divine and fully human and, through His victory on the Cross, He broke Satan's power and has complete authority over sin and death. Jesus is faithful to believers in all circumstances and, as the Servant King, is our model and example.

- We believe in God the Holy Spirit, Who inspired Scripture and brings new life to the people of God. He comforts and sustains us and leads us into all truth (John 16:13). Promised by our Lord (John 14), the Holy Spirit always points the way to Jesus, equips us with power for service and helps us to pray (Romans 8:26–27).
- We believe that the Church is Christ's Body here on earth, commissioned by Him to draw others to Himself and continue the Mission of spreading everywhere "the fragrance of Christ". As Christ's agent in the world, the church is committed to bring justice, reconciliation and peace to a world which is dark and devoid of these things.

While this is not a complete list of everything we believe, these four areas will form the basis of our teaching in the coming month.
