

Rainham & Wennington: One Parish or Two?

A Pastoral Letter from Revd Henry Pradella.

HERE ARE MANY changes in the Church of England that are taking place at the moment. Statistically there are more clergy retiring than are coming forward for ordination, (though Chelmsford is bucking that trend). The implication of this will mean the church will increasingly be less able to place clergy in every parish. One way that our Diocese is addressing this issue is to promote and create more lay ministries coming to the forefront of leadership. In addition, the Church is creating more partnerships across parishes with the aim of sharing resources, support mechanisms and partnerships in mission and ministry. The Archdeacon of Barking

asked us to consider the possibility of combining Rainham with Wennington into one parish, so we become Rainham and Wennington Parish. This is not just for the PCCs to consider, but for both church communities, and will take time to evolve. It is about looking longterm. I will stress at this point that no decision has been made and we are merely exploring such an option openly and prayerfully together. Be assured also, that such a merger would not in any way diminish the identity, make up or styles of worship in either parish. Each would retain their individual identity and continue to build on the vision that each is called to. In that respect nothing would change.

However, the idea of having a single parish would be to create greater strength, security and unity, and there would be practical options that come under consideration—one PCC with reps from both communities; one financial structure that embraces the needs of both churches and communities; more time for clergy and other

















leaders to devote energies to mission and ministry rather than a duplication of administration meetings; greater support and encouragement across the board; greater ownership and partnership in mission and ministry together.

Nathan Whitehead, our Diocesan advisor on these matters, was invited to a joint PCC meeting last year to help explain the process and inform our discussions, should we wish to pursue this possibility and explore what this may mean. He went through the process which would be necessary before such a merger of parishes could be established. The Church of England has a legal structure and there would be many checks along the route to a merger.

There is no set timescale to this. Having met last year as joint PCCs to start the ball of discussion rolling, we decided to take it to the stage of inviting both congregations at Rainham and Wennington to a joint meeting (date to be confirmed either for the Autumn or New Year) where together we can discuss this possible merger and explore any questions it might raise both for and against.

The scheme needs unanimous backing from both churches, but if necessary a majority of both PCCs and congregations would suffice. If there is then a desire from both parishes to pursue this further, then we will hold another joint PCC meeting to take the matter into the formal route with the Diocese. Nothing will be rushed and everyone will be part of the consultation and decision making process, whichever way we decide this should go. Once we have confirmed a date for meeting, I will issue more information to inform our discussion. Please pray for wisdom for our two parishes as we seek to discern the way forward under the Holy Spirit's guidance, remembering that we are His church.

Revd Henry Pradella invites us to prayerfully review our areas of ministry.

S THE BODY of Christ here at Rainham and Wennington, we will be exploring this month our areas of ministry. In both our teaching and our practical response, I am asking each of you to review and discern prayerfully what you are called to participate in as your ministry for the coming year. This is something

we have not done for a while and is overdue. We will all be starting with a blank ministries list and everyone has the equal opportunity of laying down, continuing or starting new ways of serving this church and this community.

How will this be done?

- There will be a number of lists on the notice boards in both churches, with various areas of ministry.
- We will shortly be sending out descriptions of what each area of ministry involves and there will be a hard copy of these pinned to the notice boards.
- After prayerful consideration, please add your name to whichever area(s) you want to serve in.
- There will be space to add other ministries/initiatives not mentioned that you may want to consider offering.
- This list will be up for the next two months (September & October) giving you plenty of time to explore and evaluate your input.
- Once the lists are completed we will then use these as the basis of our rotas and areas of serving.
- Training will be provided where necessary.

Three further things you need to be aware of:

- Until these new lists are compiled and activated (date TBC but hopefully November), we will remain with our current lists and rotas.
- If your name is not added to the new lists, we will assume you wish to step down from the area you are currently serving in.
- Key areas of ministry and leadership roles require you to be part of a Small Group. There are existing groups you can join, but we will also be launching three new ones this year.
