Whilst meeting and praying with our Church Wardens, the Lord gave us a prophetic picture concerning our two Parishes:

A little girl in a frock was on a bike learning to ride. Her father was holding the seat she was on and running alongside as she precariously rode with handlebars wobbling and her swaying on the seat trying to keep her balance. There came a day when her father let go of the seat and said, 'Peddle. Don't stop peddling and you won't fall off. Keep peddling!' And she kept on riding with confidence.

The little girl is the church here. The bike is the Holy Spirit, taking His church into the future. The pedals are the prayer power that generates that movement and takes the church forward. 'Don't stop peddling' is His word for the church; i.e. 'don't stop praying'. It is your prayer power that will release you into all that God is directing you into. Keep peddling and you won't fall off.

Within days of Henry sharing this word with both churches I stumbled upon this clock. I had previously



brought another clock for our new kitchen but it didn't feel right! We will obviously often look at the 'Bicycle Clock' and it will not only remind us of this prophetic word but also of all of you. Welcome to Revd Kevin Browning

Jan Stainer gives us some feedback on Revd Kevin's installation as vicar of St John's, South Hornchurch.

N 18[™] July WE were privileged to be at a service to welcome Kevin and Annette Browning to St John & St Matthew South Hornchurch as we attend the Institution, Induction and Installation of Kevin as the new vicar. Due to some legal hiccoughs in the CofE systems, Kevin had waited several months for this to happen. We were pleased to be there along with many others; members of St Luke's & Moor Lane, where Kevin had been previously, friends and family, many from Wennington, Rainham and Elm Park; and, of course, members of St John's.

The service was led by Bishop Peter, the Bishop of Barking, and Revd David Hague, Havering Area Dean. During the service there were several acts of symbolism, many of which go back a long way. Kevin declared his commitment to the people of the parish and we committed to supporting and encouraging him. Kevin was presented with water as a sign of bringing new Christians to baptism; oil as a sign of working towards reconciliation and healing; a Bible as a sign of proclaiming the Word and exploring; a copy of Common Worship as a symbol of being a man of prayer; bread and wine as a sign of celebrating the Lord's death and resurrection. Kevin also had to swear oaths to the Church and the Queen, the head of the Church of England. During another part of the service Kevin is taken to the door and given the keys as a sign of being given

the possession of the parish then taken to his seat at the front as a sign of his installation as Vicar. The dismissal was also proclaimed at the main door, which had been opened wide as a symbol of declaring our beliefs to all who are in the parish. All if this is common to all services where someone is becoming vicar of a parish.

Several members of the local clergy, a local councillor and people from the church were invited to say a few words of welcome to Kevin and Annette. As we offered prayers for them during the service, we pledged to continue to do so as they minister in South Hornchurch. We were also led in musical worship by the Gospel Choir from St Luke's in Cranham. Bishop Peter spoke to us from Jeremiah 29—"I know the plans I have for you... plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future." Kevin also spoke about God leading him here and his passion for geese. He even had a large metal sculpture of a goose in flight all constructed of cutlery!

The church was packed and we were made very welcome, including tea and coffee with a feast of cakes afterwards. We look forward to all that Kevin and Annette bring to the church and our Mission and Ministry Unit and are eager to see all that God will do amongst us as we work together for the Kingdom.

Tithing for Mission

HAT COMES TO your mind with the

phrase 'Giving to Mission'? We can often think of sending aid abroad through various charity organisations via local churches or aid agencies. Certainly, we have given our tithing in past years to such organisations and charities. But you will be increasingly aware that there are growing social needs in our own nation and even on our own doorstep here in Rainham and the surrounding areas, with rising homelessness, evictions of families with children, increase in alcohol and drug addiction, people struggling with mental health issues, loneliness and many unable to make ends meet. We don't need to look far at the consequences of such issues and dilemmas upon individuals and communities, with low self-esteems, lack of worth and value, depression and stress, a sense of hopelessness, suicidal tendencies particularly amongst young people, rising intolerance, crime and violence... the repercussions go on.

Primarily, mission is about God intervening and bringing His reconciling love into our broken lives, messed up through the ravages of sin. He is a God of mission and calls us to work alongside Him, empowered by His Holy Spirit to break the chains of oppression and set people free through

the power of the cross and the sacrifice He made in Jesus Christ. That is what we are primarily called to in this community; to share the Good News of Jesus Christ through the outworking of His love in and through us in reconciliation. As a result, our PCCs at Rainham and Wennington have agreed to use our tithing this year to help resource the areas of mission in our own community amidst the growing needs around us. We are targeting four areas; namely, Rainham Foodbank which has widened its ministry to include advice and support as well as food, Hope 4 Havering night shelter for the homeless, the Ship Centre Outreach and Rainham Community Youth Work in our schools and colleges. Each of these areas has seen a growth in its sphere of influence and extension of needs. You can read a fuller account on their work in RPCs recent APCM report. But each of these areas of mission are seeing God opening new avenues of contact and building relationships as they minister to those with needs. Please pray for the work that they do and the doors that are being open to them, not just in providing much needed social support but also spiritual direction and witnessing to the love of God through Jesus, where we are seeing lives changed as a result.

Alpha Course

The Alpha course is split into 12 weekday evening sessions and the course will begin on Thursday 20th September. The sessions

Alpha is an excellent course for those who are exploring Christianity for the first time and those who are new to the faith. Supported by grounded teaching as well as plenty of space for questions and discussion.

Waters of Life

ATER IS A RICH theme throughout

the Bible. We use water as a sign of purity in baptism and it symbolises the spiritual cleansing that comes with the acceptance of God's offer of salvation in Jesus. In Ephesians 5:26, Paul mentions water in connection with "cleansing of the Church" where it is associated directly with God's word. Jesus identifies the "streams of living water" that flow from within those who receive the Holy Spirit [John 7] and it also symbolises troublesome times in life—conversely there is nothing so calming as to walk alongside water to revive the soul.

Twice in Jeremiah, Yahweh is metaphorically identified as "the spring of living water" but in both instances Israel is rebuked for having forsaken the Lord; Isaiah also speaks of God's judgement in terms of water that will "overflow our hiding places" (Isaiah 28:17).

In the gospel of John, there are a number of references to water: His first miracle involved water, and in John 4, part of Jesus' discourse with the Samaritan woman at the well, He speaks metaphorically of His salvation as "living water" and as a "spring of water welling up to eternal life". In the previous chapter, speaking to Nicodemus, Jesus' reference to "water" and "spirit" are often understood as natural birth by water, and supernatural birth by the Spirit. This month we will look at some of the references to "water" in Scripture and see how they relate to our lives.
