

# **APCMs and Electoral Roll**

UR ANNUAL PAROCHIAL Church Meetings [APCMs] at Rainham and Wennington will be happening on Sunday 28th April. As last year, Rainham's will be after a shortened morning service, and Wennington's will be at 2pm after a short service.

Every six years, we are required to clear our Church Electoral Rolls and produce brand new ones. Therefore this year, instead of simply revising the existing Rolls, everyone will be taken off, and will need to fill out an Electoral Roll Form to be put back on. A reminder: the Electoral Roll allows you to do things like stand for or vote in PCC and Churchwarden elections,

and attend the APCM. It also helps us to have an accurate record of our church membership when it comes to Diocesan support.

Electoral Roll Forms will be available in both churches from Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> March, and the deadline for returning them to the Parish Office is the 31<sup>st</sup> March.

Some of you may have been asked to produce APCM Reports. Please ensure these are given to the Parish Office by Wednesdsy 6<sup>th</sup> March. After this, and we may not be able to include it in the printed booklet, and so the report will have to be made verbally at the APCM.

# Life to the Full

# A message from Revd David Stainer

"I have come that you might have life and have it to the full."

John 10:10

ver the past few months, we have been exploring the whole idea of "offering" and what it means to offer ourselves completely in all we do. As we continue this month, through Lent and towards Easter, we will be taking different Bible characters from the Old and New Testaments and considering what we can learn from the varied offerings they made.

Lent is the season of preparation, when we take the opportunity to examine ourselves and prepare to celebrate perhaps the most important festival in the Christian year—Easter. However, before Easter Sunday comes Good Friday when we are faced with the greatest offering that anyone ever made—Jesus' offering made for each one of us when He died on the Cross for our salvation.

Some people give things up for Lent as they prepare for Easter in an attempt to draw closer to God. I often think it is better to take something on during the Lent rather than give something up—read a Christian book; spend extra time in prayer; rekindle a relationship or make a long overdue 'phone call: Lent is certainly a time for each of us to have a spiritual "spring clean" and

perhaps allow the Holy Spirit into some of the dark corners of our lives where we wouldn't normally venture so that we can be thoroughly "cleaned".

As we all journey through Lent this year in preparation for Easter, can I take this opportunity to remind us all of the truth of the Gospel we proclaim: The Blood of Jesus Christ cleanses us from all sin—and it goes on cleansing us again and again and again! Jesus did that so that we can each be free to enjoy life to the full.

The above verse from John's gospel gives us a reason to rejoice.
