However, we are always looking for new helpers because of sickness and holidays. Tesco support us with gifts of end of



day food, also the FoodBank gives us their excess food too, but we continue to need support to pay utility bills which are a monthly expense that we struggle with, so need your continued support. The overall picture is that we praise God for a heart for His people and He is blessing them though the Ship with provision, help and Christian love. We now open Monday to Friday, 10am-2:30pm, which leaves the Ship available on Saturdays to use. Please contact me if you would like to use it for any meetings or celebrations, birthdays etc...

We are also deeply saddened by the loss of our upstairs tenant, Jackie Ross, and were privileged to be able to host refreshments and fellowship in The Ship following the funeral. Acts 2:42

HE ACTS OF the Apostles, written by Luke as a sequel to his gospel, provides an eye-witness account of the birth and spread of the church. It begins with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and continues to tell the story of the proclamation of the gospel, which began in Jerusalem and Judea, but eventually spread across the entire Roman Empire. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, the embryo Christian church was committed to teaching, healing and demonstrating God's love anywhere and everywhere.

What does this have to do with us? Throughout this year, we have taken as our theme text Romans 12:1 which is about the offering of ourselves to the Lord and, as part of the Kingdom of God, it is our desire is to reach out into our own community with God's love.

The Book of Acts gives a sense of the boldness of the first century Christians and the commitment which they had to their task. As we seek to follow their example of dedication and commitment to reach into the community, one of the verses which tells us about their life together is Acts 2:42: "They devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."

During the coming month, we will take the opportunity to look in more detail at the importance of these four things for the life of our church here in Rainham and Wennington.
