

N SUNDAY 10[™] NOVEMBER We will be commemorating Remembrance Day; remembering all those who lost their lives to the horrors of wars past and present; praying for an end to warfare, and praying for God's peace and comfort to flow over those affected. This will take place on Wennington Village Green in Wennington and at the War Memorial in Rainham.

Due to the ongoing repair works happening at Wennington, this year there will be a short service out on The Green with hymns from around 10:30am, before the usual service of commemoration. Unfortunately we will not be able to facilitate the radio feed of the Cenotaph this year.

The Four Ts

URING 2019 WE have taken as our theme text Romans 12 verse 1 which has been about the offering of ourselves to the Lord. The letter of Paul to the Romans is his great treatise about faith and everything that our Lord Jesus has done for us. Romans 12 verse 1 occurs almost half way through the letter and begins with the word "therefore". So everything that Paul writes in the first 11 chapters of the letter contain his teaching about what Jesus has done for us, and from chapter 12 onwards, Paul tells us as Christians what we should do as a result. What should we offer to the Lord in response to His offering of Himself to us? The answer of course is everything in return:

This month is the last month during which we will take an opportunity to consider the things we have to offer he Lord: Our tithes; our thanks; our talents; our time. King David, possibly Israel's greatest King from Old Testament times, was disappointed that Yahweh would not give him permission to build The Temple. However, that did not stop his from making plans and preparing everything for his son King Solomon for the task. David recognised that God knew best, and that everything is ultimately His:

"Yours, Lord, is the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendour, for everything in heaven and earth is yours. Yours, Lord, is the kingdom, you are exalted as head over all... Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand." (1 Chronicles 29: 11,12,14)
